Green Range- Ongerup Cricket Association Constitution and By-Laws

1. The association shall be called the Green Range Ongerup Cricket Association
2. The colours of the association shall be green and gold.
3. The association shall have through club representatives the power to draw up by-laws for the conduct of cricket in the association.
4. The rules of the association are to be conducted according to the rules of the Western Australian Cricket Association (Inc) except where such rules run contrary to the following By-Laws of the Green Range Ongerup cricket association.
5. The Green range Ongerup cricket association shall consist of clubs agreed to annually by the management committee, the boundaries of such clubs will be determined annually if necessary.
6. The management of all the affairs on the association shall be decided by a committee consisting of association president, association secretary, one delegate from each affiliated club. The committee shall conduct, manage and control at its absolute discretion, in accordance with these by laws and rules of cricket, the whole business and affairs of the association. They shall meet as required.
7. The officers of the association shall consist of patrons, president, vice president and secretary/ treasurer.
8. Each team shall elect one delegate to represent them on the management committee. They shall also elect one proxy delegate who may represent their team in the absence of their team delegate. Each delegate shall have one vote with the president to have a casting vote only.
9. The election of all the officers of the association shall be by a show of hands at the Annual General Meeting.
10. A fortnight's notice shall be given to each affiliated club prior to the holding of the Annual General Meeting.
11. The Association secretary shall, on the written request of an affiliated club, call a meeting of the management committee.
12. The newly elected officers of the association and club delegates shall take office immediately upon election.
13. Each delegate elected to the management committee shall also be elected to the disputes committee. The committee shall rule in the case of any disputes brought before the management committee.
14. All protests shall be forwarded to the association secretary, in writing, with five (5) days of the dispute together with a \$10 fee which will be refunded if the decision be in favour of that club which has entered the protest; or if the protest not be deemed frivolous.
15. The affiliation and registration fees will be fixed by the management committee and will be paid by affiliated clubs by the first game of the first round of the year.
16. Proper dress is encouraged
17. Any player taking part in any finals match must have played in at least **three (3)** qualifying matches in this association prior to the commencement of the finals; unless he is an itinerant player then his eligibility shall be determined by the management committee.
 - a) No player may play in a Green Range Ongerup Association game if he is affiliated with another association without the permission of the opposing captain.
18. A player may not swap teams within the association after the third scheduled match of the season.
19. Any player using indecent language or in any way misbehaving himself may be reported to the association secretary, by either captain and be dealt with as seen fit by the management committee.
20. In event of an abandoned, tied or drawn semi or preliminary, the winner shall be the team with the **highest premierships points** at the completion of minor round games.
 - a) In the event of neither team winning the grand final series the winner will be the team with the highest premierships points at the completion of minor round games.
21. All captains shall sign the scorebooks at the completion of the game.
22. Mode of matches, hours of play and commencement of the season shall be decided by the management committee
 - a) The hours of play shall be 12pm to 2. 45 pm and 3.15 pm until completion. Team batting first finish at 2. 45pm
 - b) The toss shall be no later than 11.50 am
 - c) Failure by one team to be available for the toss of the coin at 11.50 am shall give the opposing team an automatic choice of batting or bowling.
 - d) The game commences at 12 pm regardless of the number of players available to take the field.
 - e) A player may not participate in the game if he has not arrived at the ground by 1.30 pm
 - f) All finals to start at 11am. Lunch break of 45 minutes and then second innings. 11 am to 1. 45 pm; lunch ; 2.30 pm to 5. 15 pm.
 - g) If the first team to bat is bowled out before the allocated overs, then with a 10 minute changeover, there must be 15 minutes or more playing time before the scheduled lunch or tea break for the second team to bat.
- 23) The points awarded for the competition shall be based on the following incentive points
 - 9 points for an outright win
 - 6 points for first innings win
 - 0.01 points per run- applies to both innings

- 0.2 points per wicket
- 4 points for tied match
- 3 points for an abandoned match (no balls bowled)
- 10 points for forfeit
- 3 points for drawn match
- Incentive points to apply in the second innings
- Incentive points can only be assessed after 30 overs have been bowled in the game.

24) If play is interrupted by unfitness of ground, wicket or light, the following conditions apply:

a) Where play is interrupted for a period of more than ten minutes in the batting period of the team batting first, the number of balls in each team innings shall be equally on the basis of six (6) for each three (3) minutes of lost time, but the number of maximum balls scheduled for the match shall only be reduced by the reduction in the number of balls received by the team batting first.

b) Where play is interrupted for a period of more than ten minutes in the batting period of the team batting second, with no interruption in the batting period of the team batting first, unless the team is dismissed for a lesser total of runs, the result shall be a draw.

c) In the case of 24(b) occurring, then play finishes at 6 pm and fifteen overs must be bowled in the last hour.

d) Where play is interrupted in the batting period of both teams for more than ten minutes then, unless the team batting second is dismissed for a lesser total of runs the result shall be a draw.

e) Twenty- five overs per side shall constitute a game unless a side is dismissed in less than twenty five overs

f) The game shall not commence later than 2: 30 pm with tea taken early

g) Teams allowed to bowl up to three overs to complete first innings after scheduled time for tea.

25. If after the completion of the first innings the leading team has the advantage of seventy five (75) runs, they shall have the option of requiring the opposing side to follow on their innings. No side shall have more than 45 overs for batting.

26. Forty five (45) six ball overs will be available to each side.

27. A limit of nine (9) overs per bowler per innings

28. Two piece balls will be used unless otherwise agreed to by the opposing captain.

29. Balls pitched off the wicket will be treated as per WACA rules

30. Any ball pitched on the shoulder or edge of the wicket shall be called a no ball

31. Any ball pitched on the join of the wicket will be deemed a dead ball

32. Finals each year will be decided by the management committee

33. In the event of fire in a final the format for the competition of the final will be decided by the management committee.

34. Neutral umpires will be provided for all finals matches.

35. All pitches are to be approved by the management committee

36. All junior cricketers under 13 years of age are required to wear a protective helmet while batting in the senior competition and older juniors are required to do the same.

37. No Ball will be called if ball over shoulder in batsmans stance

38. Waist high full toss is deemed a no ball regardless of the bowler

39. Team sheets are to be faxed to the association recorder by the winning team **by 7 pm on the Wednesday** following the game.

Failure to do so will result in loss of points on a cumulative basis ie 1 point 1st occasion, 2points and 2nd occasion etc.

40. In the event of a forfeit, if the forfeiting team is playing an away game they must change their next home game to the same teams home ground.

41. Games may be changed to Sunday if both captains agree, **if games can not be played saturday every effort should be made to get a game played Sunday.**

42. Captains are to make contact with each other by **9 pm Thursday night**

43. Pitch and oval conditions should be checked and agreed to be in safe and playable condition as per JLT Sport Game Day Checklist, at least half an hour prior to the start of the game. If the pitch is deemed unplayable all efforts must be made to repair the pitch/playing surface, and a shortened game should be arranged, see 24. If no improvements can be made and both captains are in agreement the match either;

a) abandoned and tied.

b) rescheduled to the soonest available date.

If there is a dispute on the playability of the ground and no agreement can be reached photographic evidence should be taken and a tribunal shall be called for the week immediately following the incident. The tribunal shall consist of two representatives from each team. It will be the responsibility of the tribunal to hear the evidence of the dispute and then vote on a resolution as to if and how points shall be awarded with each team having one vote. In the event of a hung tribunal the deciding vote shall be made in consultation with the patrons.
